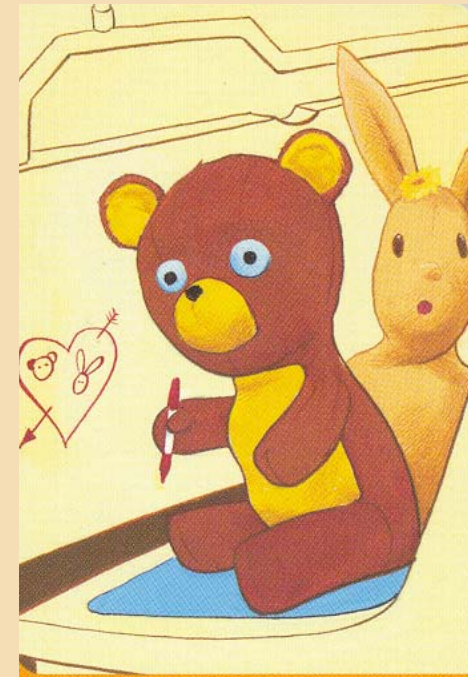

Safety Begins With Me : Metro Bus Safety—Watch your step when you get off, especially at night and in rainy weather. Metro Rail Safety—Never run after or next to the train.

Try the Artesia Transit Center —Weekdays between 6 and 9 a.m. there's a bus heading north to downtown Los Angeles every 8-10 minutes from this Metro facility, which provides free parking and convenient transfers between buses. The trip downtown takes about 40 minutes or less from the center located on 182nd St. between Vermont Ave. and the Harbor Freeway. Street address is 731 W. 182nd St., Los Angeles 90248.
