BACKGROUND

The California Vehicle Code section 40802 requires an Engineering and Traffic Survey (E & T Survey) to be conducted every five years in order to establish the posted speed limits within the City. The posted speed limits that do not have the adopted speed survey are not enforceable by the law enforcement using Radar in traffic court.

To maintain compliance with the California Vehicle Code (CVC) requirements, the City of Lawndale hired a Traffic Engineering Consultant to perform a traffic speed survey.

On October 22, 2018, the City Council awarded the Professional Services Contract to RBI Traffic Inc. to conduct an Engineering and Traffic Speed Survey on the City's major roads. These roads are as follows:

- Rosecrans Avenue
- Marine Avenue
- Manhattan Beach Boulevard
- Redondo Beach Boulevard
- Artesia Boulevard
- Inglewood Avenue
- 166th Street
- Hawthorne Boulevard

The Engineering and Traffic Speed Survey determines and updates the posted speed limit for 18 street segments on these City major roads.

STAFF REVIEW

The report presented the results of the radar survey for the 18 street segments within the City's arterial and collector streets. Based on the data collected, the 18 segments recorded speeds slightly above or below the 85th percentile of the existing speed limits, and based on the accident data and other engineering factors, the consultant recommended that the existing speed limits do not require any changes. To enable the Los Angeles County Sheriff to continue use of its radar devices, it is recommended that the study be approved and certified.

FISCAL IMPACT

No funding is required for approval and certifying of the survey.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council:

- 1. Approve the "Engineering and Traffic Survey for Speed Limits" prepared by RBI Traffic Inc. shown as Exhibit "A"
- 2. Direct the City Clerk to forward a certified copy of the report to the Los Angeles County Sheriff to be used for their traffic enforcement.

ENGINEERING AND TRAFFIC SURVEY FOR SPEED LIMITS

In accordance with procedures established by the State of California, this Engineering and Traffic Survey has been developed for the City of Lawndale as the basis for the establishment and enforcement of speed limits for selected streets within the City. The work provided herein was authorized by the City and was performed by the engineering consulting firm of RBI Traffic, Inc. The goal of the review was to determine whether changes in pre-existing conditions have occurred where older speed limits should be modified.

The requirement to perform Engineering and Traffic surveys for speed limits is based on the California Vehicle Code (CVC). CVC Section 40802 states that the State and local agencies should re-evaluate non-statuary speed limits on segments of their roadways at least once every five (5), seven (7), or ten (10) years, based on requirements set forth in the referenced section. Engineering and Traffic Surveys must be performed with the use of radar or other approved electronic devices if the use of radar is to be employed to enforce speed limits. If such a survey is not performed within the specified period from the preceding survey, the enforcement of the existing speed limit by electronic means constitutes a speed trap and evidence of such a violation would not be admissible in court. From the CVC, a "speed trap" is defined as either of the following:

- (a) A particular section of a highway measured as to distance and with boundaries marked, designated, or otherwise determined in order that the speed of a vehicle may be calculated by securing the time it takes the vehicle to travel the known distance.
- (b) A particular section of a highway with a prima facie speed limit provided by this code or by local ordinance under sub-paragraph (A) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 22352, or established pursuant to Section 22354, 22357, 22358, or 22358.3 if that prima facie speed limit is not justified by an engineering and traffic survey conducted within five years prior to the date of the alleged violation, and where enforcement involves the use of radar or other electronic devices that measures the speed of moving objects. This paragraph does not apply to a local street, road, or school zone.

The definition of a Traffic survey, as used in this code, means a survey of highway and traffic conditions in accordance with methods determined by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) for use by State and local authorities. An engineering and traffic survey shall include, among other requirements deemed necessary by the department, consideration of the following:

- (a) Prevailing speeds as determined by traffic engineering measurements.
- (b) Accident records.
- (c) Highway, traffic and roadside conditions not readily apparent to the driver.

The California Vehicle code has set certain regulations regarding the posting and enforcement of speed zones. These regulations generally reflect the viewpoint that speed zoning should be based on traffic conditions and natural driver behavior and not because of an arbitrary response to a traffic event or occurrence. Therefore, it is important to have a general understanding of the "Basic Speed Law", Prima Facie Speed Limits" and "Intermediate Speed Zones".

Basic Speed Law (CVC 22350)

All fifty states base their speed regulations on the Basic Speed Law. In California, CVC 22350 defines the basic speed law as:

"No Person shall drive a vehicle upon a highway at a speed greater than is reasonable or prudent having due regard for weather, visibility, the traffic on, and the surface and width of the highway, and in no event at a speed which endangers the safety of persons or property."



This law recognizes that driving conditions vary widely from time-to-time and place-to-place and, therefore, no set of fixed driving rules will adequately serve all conditions. The motorist will constantly adjust their driving behavior to fit the conditions encountered and must learn to do this with a minimum of assistance from the police. The Basic Speed Law is founded on the belief that a majority of motorists are able to modify their driving behavior properly, as long as they are aware of the conditions around them.

Prima Facie Speed Limits (CVC 22352)

All other speed limits are prima facie limits which, "on the face of it", are reasonable and prudent under normal conditions. The opportunity given to the driver to exceed a prima facie speed limit when it is safe to do so recognizes the fact that any posted speed limit cannot adequately reflect the many different conditions of traffic, weather, visibility, etc., that may be found on the same highway at different times.

Certain prima facie limits are automatically established by law (CVC 22352), including a 15 mph limit in alleys, blind intersections, blind railroad crossings, and the 25 mph limit in business and residence districts. There is also a part time 25 mph limit in school zones when children are present in route to or from school.

Business and residence districts are defined in the Vehicle Code as specific areas meeting a specified minimum density of roadside development. CVC Sections 235 and 515 define these regulations. A count of houses or active businesses facing on a highway must be made to determine whether or not a valid business or residence district exists. The law does not require posting those prima facie limits that are readily apparent.

Intermediate Speed Zones

State law permits local authorities to lower the maximum speed limit (55 MPH) or to raise business or residence district speed limits (25 MPH) on the basis of a Traffic and Engineering Survey. These "intermediate limits" between 25 and 55 MPH must be posted to define clearly the limits of the zone and the prima facie speed established.

Residence District (CVC 515)

A "residence district" is that portion of a highway and the property contiguous thereto, other than a business district, (a) upon one side of which highway, within a distance of a quarter of a mile, the contiguous property fronting thereon is occupied by 13 or more separate dwelling houses or business structures, or (b) upon both sides of which highway, collectively, within a distance of a quarter of a mile, the contiguous property fronting thereon is occupied by 16 or more separate dwelling houses or business structures. A residence district may be longer than one-quarter of a mile if the above ratio of separate swelling housed or business structures to the length of the highway exists.

Establishment of Speed Zones

The reason that speed limit areas and their required postings are done is to guard reasonable drivers from the unreasonable behavior of reckless, unreliable, or otherwise dangerous drivers. As with other similar laws, the limits identified are based on the consensus of the majority of those who drive the highway as to what speed is reasonable and safe. It is this type of information that is reflected in the analysis section of this report. Namely, posted speed limits are a reflection of that speed which most people deem to be safe as opposed to a minority of drivers who do not drive in a reasonable manner.

Speed zones are also established to advise drivers of road conditions or hazards that may not be readily apparent to a reasonable driver. For that reason, a field review of related road/traffic variables is conducted which considers the analytical data and accident history of particular roadway segment to determine a safe and reasonable speed imit.



Data Collection Procedures

As described in various traffic engineering documents – including information provided by the State of California, the individual locations on which radar data collection procedures were used involved considerations for the following:

- (a) Stop sign or traffic signal locations
- (b) Visibility issues
- (c) Traffic flow at intersections, cross-traffic, major driveways, crosswalks, railroad crossings, and unusual turning movements
- (d) The influence of other traffic factors on the speed of cars: such as on-street parking, roadway features, adjacent land uses, and lighting

Speed Zoning Methodology

The California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) specifies a "short method of determining speed limits on City and County through Highways, Arterial and Collector Roads Procedures."

Introduction – This short method of speed zoning is based on the premise that the reasonable speed limit is one that conforms to the actual behavior of the majority of motorists, and that by measuring motorist's speeds, one will be able to select a speed limit that is both reasonable and effective. Other factors that need to be considered include but are not limited to: the most recent two-year collision record, roadway design speed, safe stopping sight distance, super elevation, shoulder conditions, profile conditions, intersection spacing and offsets, commercial driveway characteristics and pedestrian traffic in the roadway without sidewalks.

Speed Zone Survey

- Only one person is required for the fieldwork. Speeds can be read directly from a radar speed meter.
- A section of road should be selected with representative operating speeds. If speeds vary on a given road, additional surveys should be conducted. In this case, it may be necessary to establish additional speed zones with different speed limits. The section selected should be straight and should have no traffic signal, stop sign or intersection with a major cross street.
- Speed measurements should be taken during off-peak hours on weekdays. The weather should be fair with no unusual conditions prevailing. It is important that the surveyor and his equipment be so inconspicuous as not to affect traffic speeds. For this reason, an unmarked car is recommended, with the radar speed meter located as inconspicuously as possible. It should be placed so as to be able to survey traffic in both directions and should not make an angle greater than 15 degrees with the roadway centerline.
- It is desirable to have a minimum sample of 100 automobiles in each survey. This may result in excessive survey periods for low-volume roads. Under these conditions, the survey should be conducted for a minimum of two hours, but in no case should the sample for any survey contain less than 50 automobiles.
- The California MUTCD states that speed limits are established at or near the 85th percentile speed, which is defined as that speed at or below which 85 percent of the traffic is moving. This speed can be selected directly from the data sheet. However, roadway conditions not readily apparent to the motorist such as vertical or horizontal curves or other roadway conditions that may impact sight distance may result in a further reduction of 5 mph in the recommended speed limit.
- As a check on the validity of the proposed speed limit, an analysis should be made of the two-year accident record for the section of roadway under consideration. If this record shows an abnormally high percentage of accidents normally associated with excessive speeds, the proposed speed limit should be further reduced. This is a judgment situation and will not usually be a factor.



- Short speed zones of less than half a mile should be avoided, except in transition areas.
- Speed zone changes should be coordinated with changes in roadway conditions or roadway development.
- Speed zoning in 5 mile per hour increments should be avoided if possible. A 10-mile per hour increment is preferable.
- Speed zoning should be coordinated between adjacent jurisdictions.

Local Street Exemptions (CVC 40802)

Many streets are designated as "Local" streets per CVC 40802. These streets are exempt from the radar study. Therefore, the speed limit for these streets does not require an Engineering and Traffic Survey. The code is as follows:

"for the purpose of this section, local streets and roads shall be defined by the latest functional usage and federal aid system maps as submitted to the Federal Highway Administration. When these maps have not been submitted, the following definition shall be used: A local street or road primarily provides access to abutting residential property and shall meet the following three conditions:

- 1. Roadway width of not more than 40 feet.
- 2. Not more than one half mile of uninterrupted length.
- 3. Not more than one traffic lane in each direction.

Other Conditions

Every street should be inspected for unusual traffic, roadway and roadside conditions not readily apparent to a motorist. A check should be made of the adequacy of traffic control devices, roadway alignment, width surface conditions, accident history and any unique traffic hazards that may exist. Any of these conditions may warrant the selection of a speed lower than the 85th percentile speed for speed zoning.

Radar Collection Time Frames

The hours of radar operation were restricted to off-peak periods for heavily traveled streets and to uncongested peak periods on lightly traveled streets. All surveys were conducted in fair weather.

The handheld radar unit was used from an unmarked vehicle with the meter-reading unit sustained inside the vehicle. The radar unit's calibration was checked periodically using a tuning fork.

The radar operator recorded the speed meter readings for each location on Radar Speed Survey Field Sheets included in the appendix of this report. A representative sampling of at least 100 vehicles were surveyed in both directions where possible. On low volume roads, where a total sample of 100 vehicles would result in an excessive time period, sampling was continued for a minimum of two hours and at least a total sample of 50 vehicles was attained.

Analysis Factors

Several factors were used as input to our recommendations for speed limits. These include the 85th Percentile, the 10 MPH Pace and others. These are described in detail below.

1. The **CRITICAL SPEED**, or the 85th percentile is defined as that speed at or below which 85 percent of the traffic is moving. From experience, traffic engineers have found that this is one of the most reliable factors in determining appropriate speed limits.



- Hence, the accepted practice, and one that has been used in this case, is to set the speed limit at or near the critical speed. This recognizes that other factors could be present where the above may not be appropriate. When this procedure is used, it not only conforms to that required by the State but it also provides a strong base for law enforcement personnel to properly enforce speed limits.
- 2. The **10 MPH PACE** is that continuous 10 mph incremental range of speeds in which the largest number of recorded vehicles is contained. It is a measure of the dispersion of speeds within the sample surveyed. For this element, the accepted practice to the greatest extent possible is to try and keep the recommended speed limit within the 10 mph pace after considering the critical speed and any factors requiring a speed lower than the critical speed.
- 3. The **MEDIAN (MIDDLE) SPEED** or 50th percentile speed represents the mid-point value within the range of recorded speeds for a particular roadway location. In other words, 50% of the vehicles travel faster, and 50% travel slower than the median speeds. This value is another measure of the central tendency of the vehicle speed distribution.
- 4. The **15TH PERCENTILE SPEED** is the speed at or below which 15% of the vehicles are traveling. This value is important in determining the minimum allowable speed limit, given that the vehicles traveling below this speed tend to obstruct the flow of traffic, thereby increasing the accident potential.
- 5. **MODAL SPEED:** The modal speed is the speed which occurs most frequently in the distribution (the most). It serves as another useful measure in verifying the correct recommendation for speed limits.
- 6. **STANDARD DEVIATION:** This is a mathematical element, which relates to measures of dispersion of data. It is used to assist in describing the center of speed distribution information around the arithmetic mean or the time mean speed. It also is used in the overall review of recommended speed limits and serves to verify the level of confidence of data used in making recommendations.
- 7. The MEAN (AVERAGE) is the sum of the speeds of the samples divided by the number of samples.

The numerical values of the above factors are derived from the speed distribution curves calculated for each survey location. These distribution curves represent a method of graphic analysis that compares the cumulative percentage of vehicles to the speed at which the vehicles are travailing.

Field Review

In addition to the availability of the above statistical data, a significant aspect of speed limit recommendations is based on the field review. Its importance is that existing conditions may warrant a lower speed than is actually indicated by the application of survey data. Examples of the field data collected for the purposes of analyzing related roadway characteristics as they pertain to the determination of appropriate speed limits are listed below:

- 1. Segment length, width and alignment
- 2. Level of pedestrian activity
- 3. Traffic flow characteristics
- 4. Vertical and/or horizontal curves
- 5. Driver sight distance constraints
- 6. Adjacent residential/commercial/industrial etc. zoning
- 7. Number of lanes and other channelization/striping factors
- 8. Frequency of intersections, driveways and on street parking
- 9. Location of stop signs, traffic signals, and other regulatory traffic control devices
- 10. Roadway conditions, bumps and dips
- 11. Obstructions to pedestrian visibility



- 12. Land use and proximity of schools
- 13. Uniformity with existing speed zones to/with adjacent jurisdictions
- 14. Any other unusual conditions not readily apparent to the driver

The results of the field review of related road/traffic variables are summarized on the Engineering and Traffic Survey forms found in the Appendix of this report.

Collision History

The Engineering and Traffic Survey forms summarize the available two-year accident information for the subject streets. The accident information includes the total number of accidents within each street segment and of those accidents, the number that is speed-related. This information was obtained from available data contained in the Statewide Integrated Traffic Records System (SWITRS) for the City of Lawndale.

Results and Recommendations

The following summaries: No Speed Limit Change, New Speed Limit Posting, Speed Limit Increases, Speed Limit Reductions and Summary of Recommendations present the results of the radar survey for the selected locations. The Summary of Recommendations chart at the end of this section presents the necessary analysis elements that, in addition to the field review of a Registered Traffic Engineer, led to the recommendations indicated.

Speed Limit Increases

There are no segments where an increase in the speed limit is recommended.

No Speed Limit Changes

The following segments studied are recommended for no speed limit changes based mostly on the fact that the newly measured values of the 85th percentile and 10 MPH pace are still within the parameters of the existing speed limits. Explanations for any segments that have been reduced an additional 5 MPH as allowed by the latest edition of the California Manual on Traffic Control Devices (CAMUTCD) will be found in the following section.

Support Explanations

<u>Rosecrans Avenue – Hawthorne Blvd. to Prairie Ave.</u> This section of Rosecrans Ave. is a 6-lane roadway with a two-way left turn lane. Leuzinger High School fronts this segment of Rosecrans Ave. as well as access to commercial shopping centers, residential driveways and apartment complexes. The south side of Rosecrans Ave. allows curbside parking at night while the northside allows curbside parking outside of morning commuter hours. Cars parked on the roadway can impact the ability of drivers backing out of driveways to observe approaching vehicles. The 10 MPH pace range of 35 to 44 MPH indicates that a large majority of drivers are traveling below the 85^{th} percentile and the annual accident rate of 5 speed related accidents per year is significant. Even with an 85^{th} percentile of 45.2 MPH, based on the reduced sight distance, collision rate, pace and residential frontage, and the heavy pedestrian traffic from the high school, it is recommended that the existing 40 MPH speed limit be maintained.

<u>Artesia Boulevard – Redondo Beach Blvd. to Inglewood Ave.</u> This section of Artesia Blvd. is a 4-lane roadway with a raised center median containing left-turn pockets traversing a commercial land use. Curbside parking is authorized and heavily used on both sides of Artesia Blvd. Additionally, there are a significant number of driveways with small parking lots along this stretch of Artesia Blvd. The horizontal curve in this section of the road reduces sight distance. The reduced sight distance issue is compounded by the curbside parking. The 10 MPH pace range of 33 to 42 MPH indicates that a large majority of drivers are travelling below the 85th percentile of 41 MPH. Even with the 85th percentile of 41 MPH, based on the curbside parking, heavy pedestrian traffic, and reduced sight distance from the horizontal curve, it is recommended that the existing 35 MPH speed limit be maintained.

<u>Inglewood Avenue (northbound only) – Artesia Blvd. to Manhattan Beach Blvd.</u> This section of Inglewood Ave. is a 6-lane roadway with a raised center median containing left-turn pockets traversing residential and commercial land use. Curbside parking is authorized on both sides of Inglewood Ave. during non-peak commute hours. The 10 MPH pace range of 37 to 46 MPH indicates that a large majority of drivers are travelling around the 85th percentile of 46.8 MPH. Additionally, the annual accident rate of 8 speed related accidents is significant. E&TS studies were also conducted along Inglewood Ave. at the two contiguous segments north of this. Both these sections are recommended to remain at 35 MPH. In addition, the southbound side of Inglewood Ave.for this segment as well as the segment immediately to the south, both of which are under the jurisdiction of the City of Redondo Beach, are currently posted at 40 MPH. Due to the significant speed related collision rate and in order to maintain consistency throughout Inglewood Ave., it is recommended that the existing 40 MPH speed limit be maintained.

 166^{th} Street – Prairie Ave. to Hawthorne Blvd. This section of 166^{th} St. is a 50' wide residential street with a double yellow centerline. The entire section is heavy residential frontage with driveways and curbside parking on both



sides of 166th St. Even with an 85th percentile of 37 MPH and a 10 MPH pace range of 29 to 38 MPH, based on the residential land use and reduced sight distances at residential driveways caused by on-street parking, it is recommended that the existing 30 MPH speed limit be maintained.

<u>166th Street – Hawthorne Blvd. to Firmona Ave.</u> This section of 166th St. is a 36' wide residential street with no centerline. The entire section is heavy residential frontage with driveways and curbside parking on both sides of 166th St. Additionally, 166th St. ends in a cul-de-sac 300' west of Firmona Ave. The 85th percentile of 30.5 MPH combined with the 10 MPH pace range of 22 to 31 MPH shows that the majority of drivers are traveling below 30 MPH. Based on the fact that this is a purely residential street with reduced sight distance at residential driveways caused by on-street parking, it is recommended that the existing 25 MPH speed limit be maintained.

<u>Hawthorne Boulevard – Rosecrans Ave. to Marine Ave.</u> This section of Hawthorne Blvd. is a 160' wide 6-lane roadway with a 70' raised center median containing left-turn pockets traversing commercial land use. Curbside parking is authorized on both sides of Hawthorne Blvd. as well as designated parking inside the 70' median. The 10 MPH pace range of 32 to 41 MPH indicates that a large majority of drivers are travelling below the 85th percentile of 40.5 MPH. Additionally, the annual accident rate of 8 speed related accidents is significant as is the amount of pedestrian traffic and vehicles entering the roadway from the center median parking lanes. With the high amount of pedestrian traffic, the reduced sight distance caused by on-street parking around the commercial driveways and the traffic entering and exiting the center median parking lanes, it is recommended that the existing 35 MPH speed limit be maintained.

<u>Hawthorne Boulevard – Marine Ave. to I-405 Freeway</u> This section of Hawthorne Blvd. is a 160' wide 6-lane roadway with a 70' raised center median containing left-turn pockets traversing commercial land use. Curbside parking is authorized on both sides of Hawthorne Blvd. as well as designated parking inside the 70' median. The 10 MPH pace range of 32 to 41 MPH indicates that a large majority of drivers are travelling below the 85th percentile of 41.9 MPH. Additionally, there is a significant amount of pedestrian traffic in the area and vehicles entering the roadway from the center median parking lanes. With the high amount of pedestrian traffic, the reduced sight distance caused by on-street parking around the commercial driveways and the traffic entering and exiting the center median parking lanes, it is recommended that the existing 35 MPH speed limit be maintained.

<u>Hawthorne Boulevard – I-405 Freeway to Redondo Beach Blvd.</u> This section of Hawthorne Blvd. is a 160' wide 6-lane roadway with a 70' raised center median containing left-turn pockets traversing commercial land use. Curbside parking is authorized on both sides of Hawthorne Blvd. as well as designated parking inside the 70' median. The 10 MPH pace range of 33 to 42 MPH indicates that a large majority of drivers are travelling below the 85th percentile of 41 MPH. Additionally, there is a significant amount of pedestrian traffic in the area and vehicles entering the roadway from the center median parking lanes. With the high amount of pedestrian traffic, the reduced sight distance caused by on-street parking around the commercial driveways and the traffic entering and exiting the center median parking lanes, it is recommended that the existing 35 MPH speed limit be maintained.

The project was funded using bond funds.

STAFF REVIEW

The project has been completed. Staff performed the project final inspection and found the improvements to be in conformance with the project plans and specifications.

The project had a City Council approved construction budget of \$268,392 which included a 15% contingency. The final construction cost was \$168,000.7 which is substantially lower than approved project cost, due to in-house inspection and construction management that were performed by staff.

BACKGROUND

Each year since 2005, with the exception of 2016, 2017 and 2018, the Parks, Recreation and Social Services Commission (PRSSC) has undertaken an annual fund-raising effort by volunteering to operate a fireworks sales stand on City-owned property located at the southwest corner of Hawthorne Boulevard and Manhattan Beach boulevards. In years 2016, 2017 and 2018 there was no fund-raising program due to the fact that the PRSSC had difficulty finding a replacement property for the former City-owned property which was no longer available due to the property being put out to bid for future development.

STAFF REVIEW

In year's 2005 through 2015, the City contracted with Phantom Fireworks to facilitate a fireworks sales stand on City property located at the southwest corner of Hawthorne and Manhattan Beach boulevards. Staff reached out to TNT Fireworks in 2016, 2017 and 2018 when it was evident that Phantom Fireworks was not able to find the PRSSC an acceptable property in terms of location and sales potential to operate a fireworks sales stand.

However, this past February, a representative from TNT Fireworks notified the City that a property became available on Hawthorne Boulevard located at 14411 S. Hawthorne Boulevard in the parking lot of Pep Boys adjacent to Hawthorne Boulevard. After a number of discussions at which the PRSSC discussed individual member commitment at regularly scheduled PRSSC meetings, the PRSSC determined that they were interested in facilitating a fireworks sales stand at the available property at 14411 S. Hawthorne Boulevard.

On behalf of the PRSSC, City staff began negotiating an agreement for a fireworks sales stand to be operational for the seven maximum days allowed by State law from June 28th, 2019 through July 4th, 2019 at the property located at 14411 S. Hawthorne Boulevard in Lawndale. After several weeks of discussing the provisions of the fireworks stand with TNT, TNT tailored a proposal that satisfied the desires of the City and the PRSSC.

TNT Fireworks will provide the following elements to the PRSSC for its fireworks sales stand:

• One 32-foot pre-constructed metal sales stand installed on the property no earlier than Friday, June 21st; however, no later than Monday, June 24th, 2019;

- 50/50 gross revenue split;
- Payment of all fees, permits and necessary licenses;
- Three iPads with Point of Sale (POS) System;
- Payment of all processing fees from ATM/Credit Card purchases;
- Delivery of all pyrotechnic merchandise for the stand on Thursday, June 27th (All reorders to be delivered to the Fireworks stand location no later than the next business day after order is placed);
- 24 TNT shirts, 12 hats and 12 aprons for volunteers;
- All advertising materials and components such as: flyers, mailers, feather flags, etc.;
- Two Los Angeles County Fire Department approved fire extinguishers;
- Signage, posters and flyers detailing the City of Lawndale Fireworks Ordinance;
- Provision of one California State licensed unarmed security guard from 6:00 p.m. on June 27th, 2019 until 8:00 a.m. June 28th, 2019, and from 10:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. each night and day thereafter beginning on June 28th, 2019 through July 5th, 2019, at 11:59 p.m. or until such time on that date that all merchandise is sold;
- On demand customer service at all times in which fireworks stand is operational; and
- Backup inventory for accelerated sales.

COMMISSION REVIEW

The PRSSC was kept informed by City staff as the negotiations continued and was very involved in the decision-making process. At its March 25th regularly scheduled meeting, the PRSSC discussed TNT's final proposal, deemed it satisfactory and went on record that they would like to facilitate a fireworks sales stand for 2019.

LEGAL REVIEW

The City Attorney, Tiffany Israel, has approved the attached agreement as to form.

FISCAL IMPACT

There will be no startup fees associated with the fireworks stand; however, the PRSSC will be responsible for the following payments: 1) one \$1,500.00 payment for expenses related to the location; and 2) payment of all sales taxes on the merchandise sold at this booth from the gross sales proceeds.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the Contract Services Agreement for Parks, Recreation and Social Services Commission Fireworks Stand between the City of Lawndale and American Promotional Events, Inc. West, doing business as TNT Fireworks, for an amount of 50% of gross sales to the City and the remaining 50% of all gross sales to TNT Fireworks.

CITY OF LAWNDALE CONTRACT SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR PARKS, RECREATION AND SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION FIREWORKS STAND SERVICES

This Contract Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this 20th day of May, 2019, by and between the City of Lawndale, a municipal corporation ("City"), and American Promotional Events, Inc. West, a California corporation doing business as TNT Fireworks ("Consultant"). The term Consultant includes professionals performing in a consulting capacity. The parties hereto agree as follows:

1.0 SERVICES OF CONSULTANT

1.1 <u>Scope of Services</u>. In compliance with all terms and conditions of this Agreement, Consultant shall provide the work and services specified in the "Scope of Services" attached hereto as *Exhibit "A"* and incorporated herein by this reference. Consultant warrants that all work or services set forth in the Scope of Services will be performed in a competent, professional and satisfactory manner.

1.2 <u>Consultant's Proposal</u>. The Scope of Services shall include the Consultant's proposal or bid which shall be incorporated herein by this reference as though fully set forth herein. In the event of any inconsistency between the terms of such proposal and this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall govern.

1.3 <u>Compliance with Law</u>. All work and services rendered hereunder shall be provided in accordance with all ordinances, resolutions, statutes, rules, and regulations of the City and any Federal, State or local governmental agency having jurisdiction.

1.4 <u>Licenses, Permits, Fees and Assessments</u>. Consultant shall obtain at its sole cost and expense, such licenses, permits and approvals as may be required by law for the performance of the services required by this Agreement. Consultant shall have the sole obligation to pay for any fees, assessments, taxes, including applicable penalties and interest, which may be imposed by law and arise from or are necessary for the Consultant's performance of the services required by this Agreement; and shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless City against any claim for such fees, assessments, taxes, penalties or interest levied, assessed or imposed against City hereunder.

1.5 <u>Familiarity with Work</u>. By executing this Agreement, Consultant warrants that Consultant (a) has thoroughly investigated and considered the scope of services to be performed, (b) has carefully considered how the work and services should be performed, and (c) fully understands the facilities, difficulties and restrictions attending performance of the services under this Agreement.

1.6 <u>Additional Services</u>. City shall have the right at any time during the performance of the services, without invalidating this Agreement, to order extra work beyond that specified in the Scope of Services or make changes by altering, adding to or deducting from said work. No such extra work may be undertaken unless a written order is first given by the Contract Officer to the Consultant, incorporating therein any adjustment in (i) the Contract Sum, and/or (ii) the time to perform this Agreement, which said adjustments are subject to the written approval of the Consultant. Any increase in compensation must be approved by the City Council. It is expressly understood by Consultant that the provisions of this Section shall not apply to services specifically set forth in the Scope of Services or reasonably contemplated therein. Consultant hereby acknowledges that it accepts the risk that the

services to be provided pursuant to the Scope of Services may be more costly or time consuming than Consultant anticipates and that Consultant shall not be entitled to additional compensation therefor.

1.7 <u>Special Requirements</u>. Additional terms and conditions of this Agreement, if any, which are made a part hereof are set forth in the "Special Requirements" attached hereto as *Exhibit "B"* and incorporated herein by this reference. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of *Exhibit "B"* and any other provisions of this Agreement, the provisions of *Exhibit "B"* shall govern.

1.8 <u>Environmental Laws</u>. Consultant shall comply with all applicable environmental laws, ordinances, codes and regulations of Federal, State, and local governments. Consultant shall also comply with all applicable mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency.

2.0 COMPENSATION

2.1 <u>Contract Sum</u>. For the services rendered pursuant to this Agreement, Consultant shall be compensated in accordance with the "Schedule of Compensation" attached hereto as *Exhibit "C"* and incorporated herein by this reference, but not exceeding the maximum contract amount of One Hundred Twenty Thousand dollars (\$120,000.00) ("Contract Sum"), except as provided in Section 1.6. The method of compensation may include: (i) a lump sum payment upon completion, (ii) payment in accordance with the percentage of completion of the services, (iii) payment for time and materials based upon the Consultant's rates as specified in the Schedule of Compensation, but not exceeding the Contract Sum or (iv) such other methods as may be specified in the Schedule of Compensation. Compensation may include reimbursement for actual and necessary expenditures approved by the Contract Officer in advance if specified in the Schedule of Compensation. The Contract Sum shall include the attendance of Consultant at all project meetings reasonably deemed necessary by the City.

Consultant agrees that if Consultant becomes aware of any facts, circumstances, techniques, or events that may or will materially increase or decrease the cost of the work or services or, if Consultant is providing design services, the cost of the project being designed, Consultant shall promptly notify the Contract Officer of said fact, circumstance, technique or event and the estimated increased or decreased cost related thereto and, if Consultant is providing design services, the estimated increased or decreased cost estimate for the project being designed.

2.2 <u>Method of Payment</u>. Unless some other method of payment is specified in the Schedule of Compensation, in any month in which Consultant wishes to receive payment, no later than the first (1st) working day of such month, Consultant shall submit to the City, in a form approved by the City's Director of Finance, an invoice for services rendered prior to the date of the invoice. Except as provided in Section 7.2, City shall pay Consultant for all expenses stated thereon which are approved by City pursuant to this Agreement generally within thirty (30) days, and no later than forty-five (45) days, from the submission of an invoice in an approved form.

2.3 <u>Availability of Funds</u>. It is mutually understood between the parties that this Agreement is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available by the City Council of the City for the purposes of this Agreement. The availability of funding is affected by matters outside 01001.0001/546049.6

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the City's control, including other governmental entities. Accordingly, the City has the option to void the whole Agreement or to amend the Agreement to reflect unanticipated reduction in funding for any reason.

3.0 PERFORMANCE SCHEDULE

3.1 <u>Time of Essence</u>. Time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement.

3.2 <u>Schedule of Performance</u>. Consultant shall commence and shall perform all services within the time period(s) established in the "Schedule of Performance" attached hereto as *Exhibit "D"*, if any, and incorporated herein by this reference.

3.3 <u>Force Majeure</u>. The time period(s) specified in the Schedule of Performance for performance of the services rendered pursuant to this Agreement shall be extended because of any delays due to unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Consultant, including, but not restricted to, acts of God or of the public enemy, unusually severe weather, fires, earthquakes, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, riots, strikes, freight embargoes, wars, litigation, and/or acts of any governmental agency, including the City, if the Consultant shall, within ten (10) days of the commencement of such delay, notify the Contract Officer in writing of the causes of the delay. The Contract Officer shall ascertain the facts and the extent of delay and extend the time for performing the services for the period of the enforced delay when and if, in the judgment of the Contract Officer, such delay is justified. The Contract Officer's determination shall be final and conclusive upon the parties to this Agreement. In no event shall Consultant be entitled to recover damages against the City for any delay in the performance of this Agreement, however caused; Consultant's sole remedy being extension of the Agreement pursuant to this Section.

3.4 <u>Term</u>. Unless earlier terminated in accordance with Section 7.4 below, this Agreement shall begin on June 21^{st} , 2019 and continue in full force and effect until completion of the services no later than September 5th, 2019.

4.0 COORDINATION OF WORK

4.1 <u>Representative of Consultant</u>. Maria Ortiz, Area Sales Manager is hereby designated as being the representative of Consultant authorized to act on its behalf with respect to the work or services specified herein and to make all decisions in connection therewith.

It is expressly understood that the experience, knowledge, capability and reputation of the representative was a substantial inducement for City to enter into this Agreement. Therefore, the representative shall be responsible during the term of this Agreement for directing all activities of Consultant and devoting sufficient time to personally supervise the services hereunder. For purposes of this Agreement, the representative may not be replaced nor may his responsibilities be substantially reduced by Consultant without the express written approval of City.

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4.2 <u>Contract Officer</u>. The City's City Manager is hereby designated as the representative of the City authorized to act in its behalf with respect to the work and services and to make all decisions in connection therewith ("Contract Officer"). It shall be the Consultant's responsibility to assure that the Contract Officer is kept informed of the progress of the performance of the services and the Consultant shall refer any decisions which must be made by City to the Contract Officer. The City may designate another Contract Officer by providing written notice to Consultant.

4.3 <u>Prohibition Against Subcontracting or Assignment</u>. The experience, knowledge, capability and reputation of Consultant, its principals and employees were a substantial inducement for the City to enter into this Agreement. Therefore, Consultant shall not contract with any other entity to perform in whole or in part the services required hereunder without the express written approval of the City. In addition, neither this Agreement nor any interest herein may be transferred or assigned without the prior written approval of City. Transfers restricted hereunder shall include the transfer to any person or group of persons acting in concert of more than twenty five percent (25%) of the present ownership and/or control of Consultant taking all transfers into account on a cumulative basis. A prohibited transfer or assignment shall be void. No approved transfer shall release the Consultant or any surety of Consultant of any liability hereunder without the express consent of City.

4.4 <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Neither the City nor any of its employees shall have any control over the manner or means by which Consultant, its agents or employees, perform the services required herein, except as otherwise set forth herein. Consultant shall perform all services required herein as an independent contractor of City and shall remain under only such obligations as are consistent with that role. Consultant shall not at any time or in any manner represent that it or any of its agents or employees are agents or employees of City. City shall not in any way or for any purpose become or be deemed to be a partner of Consultant in its business or otherwise or a joint venturer or a member of any joint enterprise with Consultant.

5.0 INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

5.1 <u>Insurance</u>. Consultant shall procure and maintain, at its sole cost and expense, in a form and content satisfactory to City, during the entire term of this Agreement including any extension thereof, the following policies of insurance:

(a) <u>Commercial General Liability Insurance</u>. A policy of commercial general liability insurance using Insurance Services Office "Commercial General Liability" policy form CG 00 01, with an edition date prior to 2004, or the exact equivalent. Coverage for an additional insured shall not be limited to its vicarious liability. Defense costs must be paid in addition to limits. Limits shall be no less than \$10,000,000.00 per occurrence for all covered losses and no less than \$10,000,000.00 general aggregate.

(b) <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance</u>. A policy of workers' compensation insurance on a state-approved policy form providing statutory benefits as required by law with employer's liability limits no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for all covered losses.

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(c) <u>Automotive Insurance</u>. A policy of comprehensive automobile liability insurance written on a per occurrence basis in an amount not less than \$2,000,000.00 per accident, combined single limit. Said policy shall include coverage for owned, non-owned, leased and hired cars.

(d) <u>Professional Liability or Error and Omissions Insurance</u>. A policy of professional liability or Errors or Omissions insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 per claim with respect to loss arising from the actions of Consultant performing professional services hereunder on behalf of the City.

All of the above policies of insurance shall be primary insurance. The general liability policy shall name the City, its officers, employees and agents ("City Parties") as additional insureds and shall waive all rights of subrogation and contribution it may have against the City and the City's Parties and their respective insurers. Moreover, the insurance policy must specify that where the primary insured does not satisfy the self-insured retention, any additional insured may satisfy the self-insured retention. All of said policies of insurance shall also provide that said insurance may be not cancelled without providing ten (10) days prior written notice by registered mail to the City. In the event any of said policies of insurance are cancelled or amended, Consultant shall, prior to the cancellation or amendment date, submit new evidence of insurance in conformance with this Section 5.1 to the Contract Officer. No work or services under this Agreement shall commence until Consultant has provided City with Certificates of Insurance or appropriate insurance binders evidencing the above insurance coverages and said Certificates of Insurance or binders are approved by City.

Consultant agrees that the provisions of this Section 5.1 shall not be construed as limiting in any way the extent to which Consultant may be held responsible for the payment of damages to any persons or property resulting from Consultant's activities or the activities of any person or persons for which Consultant is otherwise responsible. If the Consultant's insurance policies have higher limits and coverage than those required by this contract, the City will have access to those higher limits and coverage maintained by the Consultant.

The insurance required by this Agreement shall be satisfactory only if issued by companies qualified to do business in California, rated "A" or better in the most recent edition of Best Rating Guide or The Key Rating Guide, and only if they are of a financial category Class VII or better, unless such requirements are waived by the Risk Manager of the City due to unique circumstances.

In the event that the Consultant is authorized to subcontract any portion of the work or services provided pursuant to this Agreement, the contract between the Consultant and such subcontractor shall require the subcontractor to maintain the same policies of insurance that the Consultant is required to maintain pursuant to this Section 5.1.

5.2 <u>Indemnification</u>.

(a) <u>Indemnity for Design Professional Liability</u>. When the law establishes a professional standard of care for Consultant's services, to the fullest extent permitted by law, and 01001.0001/546049.6 5

except for the statutory limits set forth under California Civil Code Section 2782,8 applicable to services provided by a "design professional", Consultant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless City and the City's Parties from and against any and all losses, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees and costs to the extent same are caused in whole or in part by any negligent or wrongful act, error or omission of Consultant, its officers, agents, employees of subcontractors (or any entity or individual for which Consultant shall bear legal liability) in the performance of professional services under this Agreement.

(b) <u>Indemnity for Other Than Design Professional Liability</u>. Other than in the performance of design professional services and to the full extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless City and City's Parties from and against any liability (including liability for claims, suits, actions, losses, expenses or costs of any kind, whether actual, alleged or threatened, including attorneys' fees and costs, court costs, defense costs and expert witness fees), where the same arise out of, are a consequence of, or are in any way attributable to, in whole or in part, the performance of this Agreement by Consultant or by any individual or entity for which Consultant is legally liable, including but not limited to officers, agents, employees or subcontractors of Consultant.

6.0 RECORDS AND REPORTS

6.1 <u>Reports</u>. Consultant shall periodically prepare and submit to the Contract Officer such reports concerning the performance of the services required by this Agreement as the Contract Officer shall require.

6.2 <u>Records</u>. Consultant shall keep, and require subcontractors to keep, such books and records as shall be necessary to perform the services required by this Agreement and enable the Contract Officer to evaluate the performance of such services. The Contract Officer shall have full and free access to such books and records at all times during normal business hours of City, including the right to inspect, copy, audit and make records and transcripts from such records. Such records shall be maintained for a period of three (3) years following completion of the services hereunder, and the City shall have access to such records in the event any audit is required.

6.3 <u>Ownership of Documents</u>. All drawings, specifications, reports, records, documents and other materials prepared by Consultant, its employees, subcontractors and agents in the performance of this Agreement shall be the property of City and shall be delivered to City upon request of the Contract Officer or upon the termination of this Agreement and Consultant shall have no claim for further employment or additional compensation as a result of the exercise by City of its full rights of ownership of such documents and materials. Consultant may retain copies of such documents for its own use and Consultant shall have an unrestricted right to use the concepts embodied therein. Any use of such completed documents by City for other projects and/or use of uncompleted documents without specific written authorization by the Consultant will be at the City's sole risk and without liability to Consultant and the City shall indemnify the Consultant for all damages resulting therefrom. All subcontractors shall provide for assignment to City of any documents or materials prepared by

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them, and in the event Consultant fails to secure such assignment, Consultant shall indemnify City for all damages resulting therefrom.

7.0 ENFORCEMENT OF AGREEMENT

7.1 <u>California Law</u>. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted both as to validity and to performance of the parties in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Legal actions concerning any dispute, claim or matter arising out of or in relation to this Agreement shall be instituted in the Superior Court of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, or any other appropriate court in such county, and Consultant agrees to submit to the personal jurisdiction of such court in the event of such action.

7.2 <u>Retention of Funds</u>. Consultant hereby authorizes City to deduct from any amount payable to Consultant (whether or not arising out of this Agreement) (i) any amounts the payment of which may be in dispute hereunder or which are necessary to compensate City for any losses, costs, liabilities, or damages suffered by City, and (ii) all amounts for which City may be liable to third parties, by reason of Consultant's acts or omissions in performing or failing to perform Consultant's obligation under this Agreement. In the event that any claim is made by a third party, the amount or validity of which is disputed by Consultant, City may withhold from any payment due, without liability for interest because of such withholding, an amount sufficient to cover such claim. The failure of City to exercise such right to deduct or to withhold shall not, however, affect the obligations of the Consultant to insure, indemnify, and protect City as elsewhere provided herein.

7.3 <u>Waiver</u>. No delay or omission in the exercise of any right or remedy by a nondefaulting party on any default shall impair such right or remedy or be construed as a waiver. A party's consent to or approval of any act by the other party requiring the party's consent or approval shall not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary the other party's consent to or approval of any subsequent act. Any waiver by either party of any default must be in writing and shall not be a waiver of any other default concerning the same or any other provision of this Agreement.

7.4 <u>Termination Prior to Expiration of Term</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party. Upon receipt of any notice of termination, Consultant shall immediately cease all work or services hereunder except such as may be specifically approved by the Contract Officer. Consultant shall be entitled to compensation for the reasonable value of the work product actually produced prior to the effective date of the notice of termination and for any services authorized by the Contract Officer thereafter in accordance with the Schedule of Compensation and City shall be entitled to reimbursement for any compensation paid in excess of the services rendered.

7.5 <u>Completion of Work After Termination for Default of Consultant</u>. If termination is due to the failure of the Consultant to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement, City may, after compliance with the provisions of Section 7.2, take over the work and prosecute the same to completion by contract or otherwise, and the Consultant shall be liable to the extent that the total cost for completion of the services required hereunder exceeds the compensation herein stipulated 01001.0001/546049.6

American Promotional Events, Inc. - West dba TNT Fireworks PRSSC Fireworks Stand Services June 21st, 2019 – July 5th, 2019

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(provided that the City shall use reasonable efforts to mitigate such damages), and City may withhold any payments to the Consultant for the purpose of set-off or partial payment of the amounts owed the City as previously stated.

7.6 <u>Attorneys' Fees</u>. If either party to this Agreement is required to initiate or defend or made a party to any action or proceeding in any way connected with this Agreement, the prevailing party in such action or proceeding, in addition to any other relief which may be granted, shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees, whether or not the matter proceeds to judgment, and to all other reasonable costs for investigating such action, taking depositions and discovery, including all other necessary costs the court allows which are incurred in such litigation.

8.0 CITY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES: NON-DISCRIMINATION

8.1 <u>Non-liability of City Officers and Employees</u>. No officer or employee of the City shall be personally liable to the Consultant, or any successor in interest, in the event of any default or breach by the City or for any amount which may become due to the Consultant or to its successor, or for breach of any obligation of the terms of this Agreement.

8.2 <u>Conflict of Interest; City</u>. No officer or employee of the City shall have any financial interest in this Agreement nor shall any such officer or employee participate in any decision relating to the Agreement which affects his financial interest or the financial interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which he is interested, in violation of any State statute or regulation.

8.3 <u>Conflict of Interest; Consultant</u>. Consultant warrants that it has not paid or given and will not pay or give any third party any money or other consideration for obtaining this Agreement. Consultant shall comply with all conflict of interest laws and regulations including, without limitation, City's Conflict of Interest Code which is on file in the City Clerk's office. Accordingly, should the City Manager determine that Consultant will be performing a specialized or general service for the City and there is substantial likelihood that the Consultant's work product will be presented, either written or orally, for the purpose of influencing a governmental decision, the Consultant and its officers, agents or employees, as applicable, shall be subject to the City's Conflict of Interest Code.

8.4 <u>Covenant Against Discrimination</u>. Consultant covenants that, by and for itself, its executors, assigns, and all persons claiming under or through them, that there shall be no discrimination against or segregation of, any person or group of persons on account of race, color, creed, religion, sex, marital status, national origin, or ancestry in the performance of this Agreement. Consultant shall take affirmative action to insure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, creed, religion, sex, marital status, national origin or ancestry.

9.0 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

9.1 <u>Notice</u>. Any notice or other communication either party desires or is required to give to the other party or any other person shall be in writing and either served personally or sent by prepaid, 01001.0001/546049.6

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first-class mail, in the case of the City, to the City Manager and to the attention of the Contract Officer, City of Lawndale, 14717 Burin Avenue, Lawndale, California 90260, and in the case of the Consultant, to the person at the address designated on the execution page of this Agreement. Either party may change its address by notifying the other party of the change of address in writing. Notice shall be deemed communicated at the time personally delivered or in seventy-two (72) hours from the time of mailing if mailed as provided in this Section.

9.2 <u>Interpretation</u>. The terms of this Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the meaning of the language used and shall not be construed for or against either party by reason of the authorship of this Agreement or any other rule of construction which might otherwise apply.

9.3 <u>Integration; Amendment</u>. It is understood that there are no oral agreements between the parties hereto affecting this Agreement and this Agreement supersedes and cancels any and all previous negotiations, agreements and understandings, if any, between the parties, and none shall be used to interpret this Agreement. This Agreement may be amended at any time by an instrument in writing signed by both parties.

9.4 <u>Severability</u>. Should a portion of this Agreement be declared invalid or unenforceable by a judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any of the remaining portions of this Agreement which are hereby declared as severable and shall be interpreted to carry out the intent of the parties unless the invalid provision is so material that its invalidity deprives either party of the basic benefit of their bargain or renders this Agreement meaningless.

9.5 <u>Corporate Authority</u>. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto warrant that (i) such party is duly organized and existing, (ii) they are duly authorized to execute and deliver this Agreement on behalf of said party, (iii) by so executing this Agreement, such party is formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement, and (iv) the entering into this Agreement does not violate any provision of any other Agreement to which said party is bound.

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EXHIBIT "A"

SCOPE OF SERVICES

In connection with the operation of a fireworks stand during the Term by the City's agents, officials and volunteers, the following is a list of equipment, supplies and services that the Consultant shall provide to the City pursuant to this Agreement.

- One 32 foot pre-constructed metal sales stand to be installed on the property no later than Monday, June 24th, 2019 at 5:00 p.m.; however, no earlier than Friday, June 21st, 2019.
- Payment of all fees, permits and necessary licenses;
- Three iPads with Point of Sale (POS) System;
- Payment of all processing fees from ATM/Credit Card purchases;
- All merchandise delivery to the fireworks stand for the initial order shall be made on June 27th at 6:00 p.m. All re-orders shall be delivered to the fireworks stand no later than the next business day after an order is placed;
- 24 TNT Fireworks volunteer t-shirts and 12 aprons;
- 12 TNT Fireworks hats for volunteers;
- All advertising materials, including but not limited to brochures, flyers, mailers, etc.;
- All sales and training aids;
- Two Los Angeles County Fire Department approved fire extinguishers;
- Feather flags to be used for site decorations on a loan basis returnable to Consultant;
- Signage, posters and flyers detailing the City of Lawndale Fireworks Ordinance;
- Provision of one California State licensed unarmed security guard from 6:00 p.m. on June 27th 2019, until 8:00 a.m. June 28th, 2019, and from 10:00 p.m. until 10:00 a.m. each night and day thereafter beginning on June 28th, 2019, through July 5th, 2019, until such time on that date that all unsold merchandise, the stand and other items are removed from the site.
- On demand customer service at all times in which fireworks stand is operational; and
- Backup inventory for accelerated sales.

EXHIBIT "B"

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Sections 1.2, 2.3, the requirement for a policy of professional liability or Errors or Omissions insurance in 5.1(d), 5.2(a), and 7.5 are hereby waived.
- 2. Section 5.1(a) is revised to read as follows (text proposed to be added appears in bold and italics, text proposed to be deleted appears in strike through): :

"(a) <u>Commercial General Liability Insurance</u>. A policy of commercial general liability insurance using Insurance Services Office "Commercial General Liability" policy form CG 00 01, with an edition date prior to 2004, or the exact equivalent. Coverage for an additional insured shall not be limited to its vicarious liability. Defense costs must be paid in addition to limits. *Coverage* limits shall be no less than \$10,000,000.00 per occurrence for all covered losses and no less than \$10,000,000.00 general aggregate in the amount of \$20,000,000.00 in annual aggregate on a per occurrence basis for all covered losses."

3. The third paragraph in Section 5.1(d) is revised to read as follows (text proposed to be added appears in bold and italics, text proposed to be deleted appears in strike through):

"The insurance required by this Agreement shall be satisfactory only if issued by companies qualified to do business in California, rated "A-" or better in the most recent edition of Best Rating Guide or The Key Rating Guide, and only if they are of a financial category Class VII or better, unless such requirements are waived by the Risk Manager of the City due to unique circumstances."

4. Section 5.2 is revised to add a subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:

"(c) The fireworks stand will be operated on real property located at 14411 Hawthorne Blvd., Lawndale, CA 90260, owned by Icahn Automotive Group LLC. Consultant agrees to indemnify City in connection with any claim arising out of the negligent maintenance or failure to maintain such real property in connection with the City's operation of the fireworks stand pursuant to this Agreement."

"(d) City shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Consultant, its affiliates, directors, employees, and officers (collectively the "Consultant Parties", or individually a "Consultant Party") from and against any and all actions, causes of action, claims, costs, damages, deaths, expenses (including, without limitation reasonable attorneys' fees), injuries, liabilities, losses, penalties, or suits arising out of, related to, or resulting from any of the following: (i) the City or a City Party's breach or violation of this Agreement; (ii) the City or a City Party's negligent (or alleged negligent) act(s) or omission(s); and/or (iv) the City or a City Party's willful act(s) or omission(s)."

5. Consultant understands that it is leaving equipment, including the fireworks stand itself, owned or leased by the Consultant at the property located at 14411 Hawthorne Blvd., Lawndale, CA 90260, at which the fireworks stand will be operational. Such property, whether owned or leased by the Consultant, shall be left on the property at Consultant's sole risk and liability, and the City shall not be responsible for any theft or damage to such property; *provided*, *however*, City shall be solely responsible for any damage or theft to the equipment, materials and merchandise delivered to it pursuant to the foregoing Exhibit "A" until such time as the same are returned to Consultant.

6. City acknowledges and agrees that it is solely responsible for collecting, remitting, and reporting any and all sales tax applicable to its sale of "Safe and Sane" fireworks pursuant to this Agreement. In addition to the City's foregoing indemnify obligations, City shall specifically defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Consultant Parties from and against any and all judgments, interests, and/or penalties assessed, imposed, or levied against Consultant (or any of the Consultant Parties) resulting from City's failure to collect, remit, and/or report sales tax when due.

7. City acknowledges and agrees that Section 6.2 of the Agreement does not apply to, cover, or otherwise pertain to data or information which constitutes "Confidential Information" of the Consultant's, its affiliates, or its parent. For purposes of this Agreement and its incorporated Exhibits, "Confidential Information" shall be defined as and mean: (i) all of the Consultant's financial data or information (such as balance sheets, budgets, income statements, historical sales revenues, and projected sales revenues); (ii) any and all data or information about or related to Consultant's business activities, its business practices, its costs, its customers, its developments, its facilities, its ideas, its intellectual property, its "know how", its organizational structure, its operations, its prices, its manufacturers, its marketing methods, its processes, its software, its suppliers, its techniques, its technologies, and/or its trade secrets; (iii) any and all data or information identified or otherwise marked as as "Confidential" by Consultant, its agents, its directors, its employees, and/or its officers. Confidential Information is and shall remain the exclusive and sole property of the Consultant. City hereby waives any interest, right, and title in or to Confidential Information.

EXHIBIT "C"

SCHEDULE OF COMPENSATION

The following is the formula for the payment agreement between Contractor and the City:

- 1. The City shall be solely responsible for paying all sales taxes on the merchandise sold at this booth from the gross sales proceeds.
- The City shall retain Fifty Percent (50%) of the total gross revenue generated from the Fireworks Stand operated by the City during the Term. The City agrees:
 (A) to make all firework sales at the retail values provided by Contractor and (B) that the City shall not discount any sales of fireworks.
- 3. Consultant shall receive Fifty Percent (50%) of the total gross revenue generated from the Fireworks Stand operated by the City during the Term. Consultant's share of the revenue shall be paid at the time described on Exhibit "D".

A lengthy discussion ensued between the City Council and staff regarding the attendance of the commission, duties of the commission, funding, and potential replacement or transformation of the commission.

Lenore Bemis, Cable Commissioner, spoke about the possibility of dissolving the Cable Commission.

A motion by Councilmember Kearney to approve the first reading to introduce Ordinance No. 1160-19, amending Chapter 2.40 of the Municipal Code effectively dissolving the Lawndale Cable Commission.

The discussion continued between the City Council and staff regarding the options and direction to staff involving the future of the Cable Commission.

Councilmember Kearney withdrew his motion to approve staff's recommendation.

City Council came to a consensus to direct staff to come back to Council with new ideas or options, and a possible replacement to the Cable Commission. No action was take on the Ordinance as proposed.

6. Budget Adjustment for the Quarter ended March 31, 2019

Recommendation: that the City Council approve and direct the Finance Department to make budget adjustments as detailed in the staff report and summarized below:

- 1. Increase General Fund Revenue \$ 710,000
- 2. Increase Appropriations Finance Department \$55,000
- 3. Increase Appropriations Public Works \$17,000
- 4. Increase Revenue and Designate Use \$1,400,000
- 5. Budget Housing Set-Aside Transfers \$221,886
- 6. Budget Transfer of TABS Funds for Street Projects \$174,087

Finance Director Marla Pendleton, reported on the proposed budget adjustments.

City Manager Stephen Mandoki briefly spoke about reserves, returns from the State, and future investments strategies.

Councilmember Kearney inquired about the HVAC repair line item, City Manager Mandoki and Finance Director Pendleton responded with the additional repairs that needed to take place.

A motion by Councilmember Reid to approve and direct the Finance Department to make budget adjustments as detailed in the staff report was seconded by Councilmember Kearney and carried by a vote of 5-0.

SUBJECT:	CASE NO. 19-13: PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO LAWNDALE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 17.48.050 RELATING TO FENCES, HEDGES AND WALLS WITHIN RESIDENTIAL ZONES AND RECOMMENDING A FINDING OF AN EXEMPTION FROM CEQA

BACKGROUND

Front yard fences and walls in residential areas may not exceed 48 inches, with the top 18 inches being see through. Over the past couple of months, residents have expressed concerns that the maximum fence heights in the front setback areas are too restrictive in areas and limit how residents can utilize their front yard areas.

STAFF REVIEW

Lawndale Municipal Code Section 17.48.050(A) limits the maximum height of fences, hedges and walls in the front setback of residential properties to 48 inches, of which the first 30 inches may be solid and the remaining 18 inches must be see-through. Per discussions at a prior council meeting, staff has prepared an ordinance to amend LMC Section 17.48.050(A) as follows:

- Any residential property within the City that is located at the end of a cul-de-sac without a sidewalk connecting the property to an adjacent property may have a fence, hedge, or wall in the front yard setback up to a maximum of five feet (60 inches) in height subject to the following:
- The lower thirty (30) inches of the fence, hedge, or wall may be solid, but the top thirty (30) inches must be see-through.

Hence, the proposed ordinance would make such modifications to the City's existing fence, hedge, and wall requirements to allow residents with properties located on the end of cul-de-sacs, with no sidewalks, to have a greater height in their front yard areas.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, which provides that CEQA only applies to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where, as here, it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.

PUBLIC REVIEW

Notices of a public hearing were posted in the designated public place and published in the *Daily Breeze* on May 2, 2019.

COMMISSION REVIEW

The Planning Commission conducted a public hearing and reviewed this ordinance on April 24, 2019 and recommended that the City Council approve this ordinance.

LEGAL REVIEW

The City Attorney's office has reviewed and approved Ordinance No.1161-19 as to form.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council:

ORDINANCE NO. 1161-19

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAWNDALE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SUBSECTION A OF LAWNDALE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 17.48.050 REGULATIONS FOR FENCES, HEDGES AND WALLS WITHIN FRONT YARD SET BACKS IN RESIDENTIAL ZONES

<u>SUMMARY</u>: This ordinance amends the City's height standards for fences, hedges and walls within front yard setbacks for properties on cul-du-sacs without sidewalks in residential zones.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lawndale has adopted a minimum height standard for fences, hedges and walls within residential zones as set forth in Section 17.48.050 of the Lawndale Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission is charged with the responsibility of reviewing proposed modifications to the City's Zoning Code and desires to update and implement additional regulations on fences, hedges and walls, including raising the height requirement in residential zones for properties on the end of cul-de-sacs with no sidewalk; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to revise the fence, hedges and wall height requirement for the front yard setbacks of residential properties located on the end of cul-de-sacs with no sidewalk; and

WHEREAS, Case No. 19-13, was agendized and noticed for public hearing before the Planning Commission on April 24 2019; and

WHEREAS, on April 24, 2019, after conducting a properly noticed public hearing, the Planning Commission adopted Resolution No. 19-05 recommending that the City Council amend the Lawndale Municipal Code Section 17.48.050 within the City ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project amends the Section 17.48.050(A) by increasing the height of fences, hedges and walls within the front yards of properties that are located at the end of a cul-du-sac with no sidewalk to five feet, the type of activity that is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, after notice duly given as required by law, held a public hearing on Monday, May 20, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. in the City Hall council chamber located at 14717 Burin Avenue, Lawndale, California, to consider the Planning Commission's recommendations, as set forth in its Resolution No. 19-05, to amend the City's regulation of fences, hedges and walls within the front yards of properties that are located at the end of a cul-du-sac with no sidewalk.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAWNDALE, CALIFORNIA, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The first paragraph of Subsection A of Section 17.48.050 of the Lawndale Municipal Code is amended to read, in its entirety, as follows (deletions in strikethrough, additions in *bold and italics*):

"A. A fence, hedge, or wall shall not exceed six feet in height in any side or rear yard in any residential zone. Except that any property adjacent to an alley, commercially zoned property, inclusive of parking lots, railroad right-of-way and properties zoned I ("Institutional") or O ("Open Space") may have a fence not to exceed eight feet in height. Any fence exceeding six feet in height may not be constructed without a building permit. The maximum height of a solid view obscuring fence, hedge or wall located in the required front yard setback is thirty inches. Other than a described in the next sentence, a fence, hedge or wall up to forty-eight inches in height is allowed within the front yard setback provided that portion over thirty inches is see-through, as defined herein, except for those fences permitted by subsection (C)(2) of this section. Fences within the front yards of properties that are on the end of a cul-du-sac with no sidewalk may have a fence, hedge or wall up to five feet provided that the portion over thirty inches is see-through as defined herein."

SECTION 5. This ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, which provides that CEQA only applies to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where, as here, it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question would have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.

SECTION 6. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of any competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any portion of the ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 7. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this ordinance, and shall make a minute of the passage and adoption thereof in the records of and the proceedings of the City Council at which the same is passed and adopted. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days after its final passage and adoption, and within fifteen (15) days after its final passage, the City Clerk shall cause it to be published in a newspaper of general circulation and shall post the same at the City Hall and the United States Post Office, Lawndale Branch.

BACKGROUND

Beginning in 1950, the Lawndale community created a Pirate Days parade. The Pirate Days event began as a means to raise funds for the Optimist Youth Club. The annual event included a parade, carnival rides, games, and the naming of a Pirate Days Queen.

In 1960 the event was re-named "Lawndale's Fiesta Days" and it retained the same activities, including the naming of a queen. In 1961 the event's name was again changed to the "Lawndale Community Fair" - there was still a parade.

By the mid-1960's, Lawndale's annual parade came to be known as the Lawndale Youth Day Parade. After an absence of several years, which began in 2002 due to budget reductions, the Lawndale Youth Day Parade returned to the community in April 2008 and the theme of the 2008 parade was again "Pirate Days". The annual parade theme was then reviewed annually by the Parade Committee.

In 2018 (*see below*), the Lawndale Youth Advisory Committee discussed the possibility of changing the name of the annual event and removing "Pirate Days".

ADMINSTRATION

1. Youth Day Parade Recap – Staff gave a recap of the Youth Day Parade and discussed which elements worked and which did not. The pros included: parade was short and the car show was neat. The cons included: the theme of the parade remained the same as Pirate Days and they would like to see a change in the future. Committee members Amy and Kaleb are interested in changing the theme each year and would like to see a sci-fi or sports theme. The committee members that participated in the parade by riding in the convertible thought it was a lot of fun and would like to do so again next year.

STAFF REVIEW

The Youth Day Parade has evolved over the years. In the early 2000's the pirate theme was popular due to, in large part, the popularity of the Pirate of the Caribbean movies. The popularity and excitement surrounding those films has since subsided. In addition, due to financial and insurance coverage issues, the actors, including the Captain Jack Sparrow/Johnny Depp look-a-like, once hired to be pirates have not been a part of the parade since 2015.

This year's parade involved Lawndale Elementary School District (LESD) children designing a Parade logo. In the future, both the Youth Advisory Committee and the Parade Committee could work together to select an annual theme. The selected theme can then be used to have LESD students design an annual logo for the parade.
