**Operation of City Parks at School District Sites** 

#### BACKGROUND

As part of the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2020/21 budget, the City Council directed that City staff terminate its three agreements with Lawndale Elementary School District (LESD) under which the City operates parks at three LESD-owned sites. The agreements each required a one-year notice of termination, and so each was due to expire in July of this year.

At the City Council meeting of May 17 of this year, the City Council again considered the operation of the City's parks and direction was given to staff and the City Attorney's office. Specifically, the City Council directed that the pending termination of the agreements under which the City operates parks at three school sites be delayed if possible and a new temporary agreement be put in place to allow time for the City and LESD to determine whether they could negotiate a new agreement for the long-term operation and upkeep of the parks on terms acceptable to both parties.

The City Attorney's office has agreed in concept with the LESD legal counsel on the format of a brief and simple letter agreement that will carry out the City Council's direction. The letter agreement will come to the City Council at its meeting of June 21 for approval.

Randall Abram, Resident, spoke of the fireworks manufacturers contributing to the cost of the illegal fireworks suppression plan and inquired on the final stages of the plan.

#### F. CONSENT CALENDAR

Councilmember Suarez commended Public Works Department for following up with the residents when a project is completed.

Mayor Pro Tem Kearney requested paint be matched when graffiti is painted over. Director Lee responded they attempt to match the existing color and reach out to the private property owners for any available identical colors.

Councilmember Cuevas commended all of Public Works Department.

Mayor Pullen-Miles expressed customer service is important and agreed with the vision of the department.

The City Council reached a general consensus to receive and file the presentation.

7. <u>Agreement for Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) Administration</u>
Assistance and Implementation and Labor Compliance Fiscal Year 2021-22

Recommendation: that the City Council approve the professional services agreement with Michael Baker International, Inc. for CDBG Administration and Labor Compliance Services, for an amount not to exceed \$56,690.00

Community Development Director Sean Moore reported on the Agreement for Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) Administration.

A motion by Councilmember Cuevas to approve the professional services agreement with Michael Baker International, Inc. for CDBG Administration and Labor Compliance Services, for an amount not to exceed \$56,690.00, was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Kearney and carried by a vote of 5-0.

#### 8. Reconsideration of the City of Lawndale Crossing Guard Program

Recommendation: that the City Council provide direction to staff regarding crossing guard services, and whether to include \$124,848.00 in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Budget for crossing guard services.

Community Services Director Mike Estes reported on Reconsideration of the City of Lawndale Crossing Guard Program.

Councilmember Cuevas concurred with Mr. Estes, possibly reducing the crossing guard operating hours from 3.5 hours to 3 hours daily.

Mayor Pro Tem Kearney expressed concern over the unknown of next school years opening and requested the services be waited. Mr. Kearney went on and spoke on children's safety, the light signals and crosswalks in place, and parent responsibility.

Councilmember Suarez inquired on the schools participation in the matter and if the contract with 10 crosswalks can be amended during a school year. Community Services Director Mike Estes responded the school district designated the crosswalks in year 1996 with no changes yet. City Manager Kevin Chun added that Council and staff have not discussed the Crossing Guard Program with the school district in depth.

A dialogue continued between the Council and staff regarding the budget for crossing guard services and the safety of children and pedestrians.

A motion by Councilmember Suarez to proceed with crossing guard services and place the item for budget subcommittee review and the future budget adoption meeting, was seconded by Councilmember Cuevas and carried by a vote of 4-1, Councilmember Kearney voting No.

#### 9. <u>City Council Parks Subcommittee Recommendations</u>

Recommendation: that the City Council (a) consider, select, and provide direction to staff on one of the recommendations from Parks Subcommittee members Kearney or Cuevas regarding the shared parks, or provide staff with alternative direction; and (b) provide direction to staff whether to include \$147,420.26 in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Budget for maintenance of the three shared parks.

City Manager Kevin M. Chun reported on City Council Parks Subcommittee Recommendations.

A lengthy dialogue ensued between the Council and staff regarding the budget and school partnership for park use and maintenance.

A motion by Councilmember Cuevas to direct staff to negotiate 3 new agreements for each park with the Lawndale Elementary School District for 2 years and have constant ongoing communication with the School District regarding maintenance and use costs, was seconded by Councilmember Hofmann Gorman and carried by a vote of 4-1, Councilmember Kearney voting No.

#### H. <u>CITY MANAGER'S REPORT</u>

City Manager Kevin Chun announced June 11, 2021 as the updated date for the Johnson and Johnson mobile vaccine clinic sponsored by the County of Los Angeles. City Manager Chun spoke about the use of illegal fireworks and reminded everyone of the violations the City will issue for the use of illegal fireworks.

#### ITEMS FROM CITY COUNCILMEMBERS

#### 10. Mayor/City Councilmembers Report of Attendance at Meetings and/or Events

Councilmember Cuevas attended Little League's opening day and a conference call with League of California Cities and Senator Bradford. Ms. Cuevas inquired if the City is reviewing the new implementation of SB 1383, Organic Waste regulation program. City Manager Chun responded staff and the waste consultant has been closely monitoring the legislation and will have ordinances in place by the end of the year.

Councilmember Suarez attended the South Bay Cities Council of Governments meeting and commended staff on the creativity for the Illegal Fireworks banner.

Councilmember Hofmann Gorman commended City Manager Chun, Public Works Director Lee, all public works staff for the paving of the street in her neighborhood and reminded everyone of the illegal fireworks violations and penalties.

Mayor Pro Tem Kearney attended the California Contract Cities Association meeting, the Sherriff's Liability Trust and Oversight Committee, and Helping Hands Pantry giveaway in Torrance.

Mayor Pullen-Miles attended a meeting with the City's representative for Southern California Edison and reiterated the penalties for the use of Illegal fireworks.

#### I. <u>CLOSED SESSION</u>

At 8:50 p.m. the City Council entered into closed session.

#### 11. Conference with Labor Negotiator

The City Council will conduct a closed session, pursuant to Government Code section 54957.6, with the City Manager, the City Attorney and the City's negotiators, regarding labor negotiations with Local 1895, Council 36, American Federation of State, County

and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, representing the City's mid-management and classified employees.

At 9:39 p.m. the City Council entered back into open session.

City Attorney Gregory M. Murphy reported that the City Council met in Closed Session to discuss the item listed on the Closed Session agenda. The City Council was updated on the item and there was no reportable action taken.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Lawndale ("City") contracts with Los Angeles County ("County") for building and safety services and is charged the rates adopted by the County in 2021. Additionally, on July 1st of every year, the County increases their permit fees based on the Consumer Price Index ("CPI"), as published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics for the Greater Los Angeles Area (See Attachment "A"). Moreover, contract cities like the City, utilizing the services of County's Building and Safety Department, often use a multiplier that is applied to the County's permit fees to recover administrative and staff services costs incurred for building plan check, inspections, record keeping, code enforcement and other miscellaneous services.

Per State law, the City Council must authorize the 2.0 multiplier that the City applies to the permit fees to recover the City's costs to provide these services in addition to the costs for the County's services. Moreover, as the County is increasing its fees with the annual CPI increases, to remain compliant with statutory requirements, staff is presenting this report to justify the City's implementation of the 2.0 multiplier. This item will be brought forward annually for the City Council's consideration each year that the County increases its fees for building and safety services.

To clarify, the City is not reviewing or approving the County's annual CPI increases. The CPI increases are pass through fees adopted by the County. This matter has been properly noticed for a public hearing as required by Lawndale Municipal Code Chapter 3.32.

#### STAFF REVIEW

#### Time and Materials Study

Staff prepared a time and materials study which includes the City's direct and indirect costs for providing building and safety services (See Attachment "B"). An example of a direct cost is the amount invoiced by the City's building and safety contractor (Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, Building and Safety Division). The County provides counter services, plan check, permit issuance and construction inspections services as needed by the public. Other services provided by the County include assistance with code adoptions, reports, statistical records of building activities, and technical expertise as requested by the City. Other direct costs that are incurred include City personnel costs such as records

management, direct client service, building code enforcement, general supervision and custodial services. As shown in Attachment "B", the costs include the following:

- Staffing costs (Director of Community Development, City Manager, Code Enforcement Officer, and Planners);
- Personnel overhead costs;
- Utilities:
- Supplies; and
- Custodial.

The City's Building Division is subject to normal overhead rates that include supervision costs (i.e. management costs), various staff support, pro rata share of building utilities, insurance and maintenance expenses, miscellaneous office supplies and furnishings.

#### Multiplier

Pursuant to State law, public agencies may only collect fees that represent the reasonable estimated cost to provide a service. The City's fees have always complied with this mandate and often charges fees lower than those authorized by law. Hence, some jurisdictions have significantly higher permit fees than those charged by the City. The higher fees typically reflect the full cost allocation and recovery for services provided (i.e. value of space, pro-rata share of utilities, pro-rata share of personnel and support functions, etc.). As shown on the attachments, the simplification of the City's costs for the services provided by City staff in conjunction with the Building Division services provided by the County of Los Angeles resulting from the modifier results in lower fees. As an example, the multiplier is added onto the permit fee, plus the CPI of 2.2 percent, times the 2.0 multiplier, results in a fee.

The multiplier utilized by other cities that contract with the County for building and safety services range from 2.5 to 3.0 (Lomita and Rolling Hills Estates); whereas, the City's proposed 2.0 multiplier is significantly less than other contract cities, although up slightly by .05 due to increased overall costs in managing the contract (See Attachment B-Building Service Costs Analysis). The proposed effective date for the new fees is July 12, 2021.

### ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because the creation of a government funding mechanism which does not involve any commitment to any specific project is not a "project" under CEQA pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080 and CEQA Guideline 15378(b)(4).

#### LEGAL REVIEW

The City Attorney's office has reviewed Resolution No. CC-2106-022 and has approved it to form.

#### PUBLIC NOTICING

Notices of a public hearing were posted in the public noticing board located just outside City Hall and published in the *Daily Breeze* on May 14, 2021 and May 19, 2021 pursuant to the City's public noticing

requirements. As of the drafting of this staff report, no comments were received from the public concerning this project.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

No budget appropriation is required. Adopting the revised building permit fee schedule will reduce the use of general funds to cover the operational costs of the Building Division.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council

- Conduct a public hearing to receive testimony regarding the City's Building Code Fee Schedule
- Adopt Resolution No. CC-2106-022

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAWNDALE, CALIFORNIA ADOPTING A REVISED FEE SCHEDULE FOR BUILDING, ELECTRICAL, MECHANICAL, PLUMBING, AND GRADING PERMITS AND SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE PUBLIC

WHEREAS, requests for certain services from the City of Lawndale ("City") are made by the public to the City to allow the public to comply with the Lawndale Municipal Code and state and federal laws; and

WHEREAS, the provision of building, electrical, mechanical, plumbing, and grading permits and services by City staff occur at an expense to the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has always intended to recover the costs it incurs for providing such services to the general public by collecting fees to reimburse the City's costs; and

WHEREAS, the City is currently collecting such fees pursuant to a 2020 fee schedule enacted to adequately reimburse the City for its expenses; and

WHEREAS, City staff has prepared the updated cost evaluation, justification, and fee schedules attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and incorporated herein by reference for the permit fees and charges proposed to be levied for providing certain building, electrical, mechanical, plumbing, grading and landscape services; and

WHEREAS, the California Government Code requires that fees for services charged by municipalities not exceed the cost of providing the service for which the fee is levied and that no fee or service charge or increase in an existing fee or charge may be levied without the public having an opportunity to make oral or written public comment at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting; and

WHEREAS, Lawndale Municipal Code Chapter 3.32 requires the City Council to conduct a public hearing before the City adopts any new or updated administrative fees; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, after notice duly given as required by law, held a public hearing on June 7, 2021 remotely via Webex in full compliance with and as authorized by Executive Order N-29-20 to consider staff's recommendation on this matter; and

WHEREAS, based upon oral and written presentations by City staff and members of the public, including but not limited to the staff report, exhibits, attachments, the fee analysis, the City Council now desires to adopt updated fees for certain building, electrical, mechanical, plumbing, grading, and landscape services.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAWNDALE, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. The fees set forth in Exhibit "A" does not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of providing each such services to the public.

SECTION 3. The City Council hereby adopts the fee and cost schedules attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A" as the City's fee schedule for providing such building-related services effective July 12, 2021.

SECTION 4. As of the effective date of these new fees all prior inconsistent fees are rescinded.

SECTION 5. That the adoption of these fees is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because the creation of a government funding mechanism which does not involve any commitment to any specific project is not a "project" under CEQA pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080 and CEQA Guideline 15378(b)(4).

SECTION 6. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of any competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof not declared invalid or remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution, and unconstitutional without regard to whether any portion of the ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 7. <u>REPEAL OF PRIOR RESOLUTIONS</u>. That all portions of prior resolutions which adopted fees for building, electrical, mechanical, grading, and plumbing services are hereby repealed as of the effective date of the fees adopted pursuant to this resolution.

SECTION 8. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution, and shall make a minute of the passage and adoption thereof in the records of and the proceedings of the City Council at which the same is passed and adopted.
