TWO OPTIONAL ELEMENTS


- Economic Element

WHAT IS THE HAWTHORNE BOULEVARD SPECIFIC PLAN?

- Used to systematically implement the General Plan in a particular geographical area.
- Implement more distinctive standards such as design, parking, land use, landscaping, etc.



WHY THEY NEED TO BE UPDATED

- The city's General Plan was adopted by the City Council on December 17, 1991.
- The last significant update was in 2016 to adopt the Safety Element.
- The HBSP was originally apart of the General Plan and was later removed from the document and adopted as its own specific plan in 1999.
- The last notable revision to the HBSP was on June 2009.

Undesirable:


- Automotive uses
